- Even during registration families are provided all sorts of resources.



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SUPPORT

Students receive many different types of screening to make sure their health, well-being, and development are taken care of. Screenings such as – height, weight, vision, hearing, developmental, social emotional, and dental screenings.



This year over 750 students have completed the ASQs Developmental Screenings (Ages and Stages Questionnaire)

SUPPORT

- From the ASQs it was discovered that Fatiha's son had a speech delay when he was 24 months old
- Through the help of the Teachers and School Community
 Worker he was assessed and received the services he needed.




TRUSTING RELATIONSHIPS

Celebrating Culture – Diversity in Students


In 2022-23, ECE Department enrolled 712 Dual Language Learning students in Infant/Toddler and Preschool programs.
